

Leadership Program cohort
convened for their final session and
graduation in September 2022. The
cohort aspired to create something
for Milton-Freewater that would be
accessible to all, provide a form of
recreation, and contribute to
community beautification. As their
final project, the class installed
public chalkboards at four locations
in town.

The community has been incredibly supportive of this initiative, and the chalkboards fill up so quickly that the cohort has been asked to expand the chalkboards' size or install more.

The grant targets at-risk youth and provides them with opportunities for academic enrichment and offers a broad array of additional services, programs and activities.



Sixteen Polk County entrepreneurs participated in RDI's Spanishlanguage Childcare Business Training in Dallas, Oregon this summer, leaving the course eager to start or grow their business. The program builds skills for existing childcare providers and leads to the creation of new businesses in areas where childcare is in short supply.

Session topics include regulatory requirements, marketing, record keeping, and the day-to-day management of a childcare facility. Through the course, participants also build relationships with the local Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) organization for ongoing support.
