

BUILDING LEADERSHIP SKILLS TO STRENGTHEN RURAL VITALITY

RDI's Rural Community Leadership program provides a foundation for vital rural communities by training a critical mass of connected leaders. Over the last 20 years, we have trained over 10,000 leaders in rural communities throughout the Pacific Northwest. In 2023. RDI brought this opportunity for people to get involved at the community level while building their own individual skills to new, emerging, and active leaders in four rural communities in Oregon and Washington. Cohorts included the 19th year of partnership with the Sherwood Trust, and a leadership training for Othello, WA, as part of the USDA Rural Placemaking Innovation Challenge.



RDI's Collective Rural Leadership programs create diverse pipelines of engaged rural community members working together to lead local action and solutions.

Our trainings include Rural Community Leadership, Lunchtime Leadership, and the Rural Civic Engagement Project.

TAKING ACTION FOR CHANGE

As part of our trainings for leaders to understand and advocate for ruralspecific issues at the local, state, and federal level, RDI partnered with the Center for Women's Leadership to create "Turn Up Your Voice," a Rural Civic Engagement program focused on educating and connecting women leaders throughout rural Oregon. Topics included understanding local and state government, how to create support for the rural issues they face in their communities, and how to develop messaging. The final session took place in Salem, where participants gathered to meet with their representatives to speak up about the concerns they're facing in their communities.

BUILDING RURAL LATINO WEALTH

As our Spanish-language team continues to meet the needs of people in rural communities, we created more opportunities including our Gana, Ahorra, Invierte personal finance education training and a Small Business Grant program. We continued delivering Pasos al Éxito financial literacy and business trainings for new and aspiring entrepreneurs, with trainings for starting and running food businesses and homebased child care businesses. Program participants reported feeling empowered and eager to try something new to improve their lives and their livelihoods.

RDI was honored to be the recipient of a **Business Oregon Economic Equity** Investment Program grant award to support Latinos in rural Oregon to build wealth through personal investing/ financial education, and small business start-up and growth. Through this award, RDI provided Small Business Grants to past participants of our Spanishlanguage programs. These grant opportunities for entrepreneurs and small business owners to start a new business or expand an existing one were awarded to child care, food, marketing, construction, and landscape businesses across Oregon.

We also launched our wealth building training, Gana, Ahorra, Invierte, in response to demand for investment-focused education. This personal finance training taught in Spanish is focused on personal money management, investment fundamentals, and retirement planning. Participants learned about building wealth to create safety nets for themselves and their families, with an opportunity to receive investment seed money. Thanks to the National Association for Latino Community Asset Builders and Wells Fargo for their support of this effort.



RURAL PLACEMAKING IN OTHELLO, WA


We were thrilled to partner with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the City of Othello, Adams County Development Council, Innovia Foundation, Avista Foundation, Umpqua Bank, Reinventing Rural, local organizations, and community members on Elevate Othello, a multi-faceted placemaking program to improve community vitality and foster economic growth in the community of Othello, Washington. Through a diverse and engaged community team, focus groups, and local events, Othello developed a community-led vision and action plan that provides a roadmap for Othello to become the community residents want to see. As part of the Rural Placemaking Innovation Challenge grant, RDI supported the visioning process and delivered a Rural Community Leadership Training and a youth entrepreneurship training, with more opportunities to come in 2024.
